

## April-May 2021 Newsletter

Below are highlights from the Watersedge April 17 board meeting, along with other information. We hope you find this helpful and welcome your suggestions for future communications.

- Tree Replacements—About 125 trees have been planted along Highway 58 and between
  the Park and Flip Flops, and drip irrigation lines have been added. Please do not cut or trim
  these trees. Also, please do not walk between the trees as a shortcut to enter or exit the
  park. Anyone who damages the trees by cutting, trimming, or walking between them will be
  held responsible for the cost of replacing them.
- Marsh Nourishment—Board members met with engineers to consider modifying our CAMA permit for a marsh rebuilding project and possibly for additional piers. Funding has been approved for initial coordination, surveying, design, and permitting, with additional requirements to be addressed later.
- Water Valve Replacements—The Park's main water valves have been replaced, which will
  enable future repairs to be made by shutting off only one small section instead of the entire
  Park. Also, additional shutoff valves were added between the main water connection and
  several mobile homes.

- Water Usage—Costs for water use increased significantly last year, and the board discussed ways the Park could reduce water usage, especially related to irrigation systems and toilet leaks. If costs cannot be controlled through conservation, additional charges may be passed along to residents.
  - As a reminder, grass watering should be done in the early morning. Sprinklers should not be used mid-day or overnight. Automatic irrigation systems that operate on a routine basis should be used no more than two times a week, or three at the most, and turned off on Saturday and Sunday.

- Children—We love having children in our park and are pleased to see so many of them enjoying themselves. However, there have been concerns expressed about some behaviors that are inappropriate from children whose parents reside in the Park and of guests' children. Parents should ensure that children are behaving responsibly and not running through other people's yards, climbing on their decks, blocking traffic, or creating disturbances (especially during quiet time from 11 pm to 7 am). Children on bikes should be respectful of adults who may be walking on park roads. Bicycles are not to be ridden on a neighbor's yard without permission of that owner.
